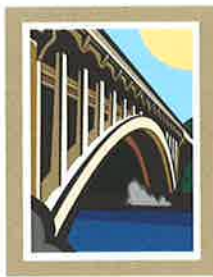

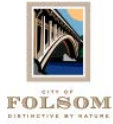

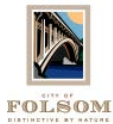

My direct salary is \$42/hr. What I gave you in my email was salary plus benefits and overhead. In other regions where I have worked, the granting agencies typically reimburse for direct salary plus benefits. Background

The ARB SWRP would be based on and integrated with the ARB IRWMP. OWP would apply for a Proposition 1 planning grant to develop the ARB SWRP, with help from regional stakeholders. State Board Staff, which include the Division of Financial Assistance that awards the Prop 1 planning grants, encouraged pursuit of the proposed effort.
Draft Approach	OWP will facilitate meetings to plan development of the SWRP such that it is in line with the SWRP guidelines issued by the State Water Board in December 2015. Based on those meetings, OWP will write the SWRP, develop associated tools, and present drafts for review and comment. RWA will coordinate update of the OPTI, the IRWMP management tool, such that it provides a means for tracking SWRP projects.
Draft Scope	See the "Scope" tab for the proposed scope. Primary tasks are based on Prop 1 grant-required categories. Sub-tasks are based on reviews of the SWRP guideline requirements and identification of items already covered by the ARB IRWMP.
Cost	OWP estimates it will cost approximately \$350,000 to manage the grant, facilitate planning, and develop the SWRP and tools and \$350,000 of stakeholder planning and collaboration (a 50% match)

The City of Sacramento understands that Sacramento State’s Office of Water Programs (OWP) is submitting an application to the State Water Resources Control Board to receive a grant under the Proposition 1 Stormwater Grant Program (SWGP). Grant funds would be used to develop a Stormwater Resource Plan (SWRP) for the American River Basin (ARB). Water Code section 10563 (as amended by Senate Bill 985) requires public agencies to develop a SWRP as a condition of receiving grant funds from a bond for storm water and dry weather runoff capture projects. Being part of this SWRP will allow the City to apply for storm water capture and low impact development implementation projects in the storm drainage system and CSS.

The Sacramento Stormwater Quality Partnership (SSQP) comprised of Sacramento County and the cities of Sacramento, Citrus Heights, Elk Grove, Folsom, Galt and Rancho Cordova will also contribute **\$10,000** as a cash contribution towards the grant's 50% match requirement. The \$10,000 cash contribution will be provided as technical assistance by Larry Walker Associates, Inc. (LWA) under the SSQP **Annual Monitoring & Regulatory Support** contract. 

 **This is a message from the State Water Resources Control Board.**

The State Water Resources Control Board's Division of Financial Assistance (Division) is pleased to announce that the Deputy Director of the Division has approved the Recommended Funding List for the Storm Water Grant Program's (SWGP's) Proposition 1 Planning Grant solicitation. By this action, grants have been awarded to 28 projects totaling approximately \$9.5 million in grant funds and are being matched by over \$8.8 million in local funds. The list of awarded projects is posted on the SWGP webpage (www.waterboards.ca.gov/swgp). All applicants will be notified of the

funding award decision individually.

These grants will help public agencies and their partners create either a watershed-wide Storm Water Resource Plan, or develop detailed plans for specific storm water capture projects. These grants help support the State Water Board's [Storm Water Strategy](#) and a major shift in California in how we think about storm water. Rather than viewing storm water only as a nuisance due to threats posed by flooding or pollutants in storm water, communities, such as those just funded, are looking for ways to turn storm water into a resource to combat drought and the effects of climate change.

In addition to funding these planning grants, we had a solicitation for proposals for implementation projects that were due July 8, 2016 by 4 pm. We plan to have a second round of implementation funding available in early 2018. The Department of Water Resources will have Prop 1 funding available that could fund storm water capture projects through its [Integrated Regional Water Management Program](#).

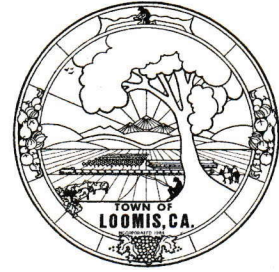
